They have actually gotten worse since the last update. The opposition leaders have resigned and left the country, but they have encouraged their followers to step up the demonstrations from three days to five each week. So now there is chaos in several major Kenyan cities and the demonstrators are being tear gassed, beaten, and water cannoned. The shops and businesses have to close and the economy is suffering. We are limited to where we can go and what we can do so it is hard to get things done. We also don't want the new van or car stoned or people injured. The ICC is talking of arresting the leaders for crimes against humanity for the people injured or killed during these demonstrations. Again, we are safe, but pray for the safety of those in other areas. A new election is scheduled for October 26.

On another note, Paul Willy, a son, Reverend, pastor, and board member recently had a slight stroke and has also been diagnosed with Parkinson's. Now he has also been diagnosed with diabetes. The cost of his medicine is very high so we are asking people to sponsor him for \$100 per month total. You can give all or part. He is a very great soul winner and evangelist.
