Barbara Riley, Betty Seuis, and Riley's granddaughter, Danielle, arrived three days after I got back and we spent a wonderful two weeks visiting the churches here and taking a wonderful trip to Bungoma to see the new Thomas Evangelical Church, named for Betty's husband, and see the new Riley Church building. We were also able to visit three other churches, one now meeting outside because they cannot fit in the shop anymore where they had been meeting. They really need



a plot so they can build a mud building to meet in.

Both Betty and Barbara were surprised at both the physical and spiritual growth of the ministry. But as I said in America, "WE HAVE ONLY JUST BEGUN." THANKS FOR PARTNERING WITH US.
