Dear Family and Friends,

I am beginning to understand a little of why eternity is forever. Because it will take that long to praise and thank God for all He does for us, day by day, hour by hour, minute by minute!!

Most of you know that KEM has had a vision of having a Bible Belt across Africa. We had started some Bible studies in Uganda, but that has been put on hold for now. However, God gave us contact with some people at Kakuma, Kenya's largest refugee camp, which houses over 185,000 people from 21 different African countries. Kenya works with the UN to shelter an overwhelming number of displaced and desperate people. Now, with your help, KEM has a chance to take the gospel there.

Last month, Rev. Fitz and Rev. Simon flew to Kakuma (375 miles north of Nairobi) and met with the potential ministry leaders there. They spent several days going over our doctrine, constitution, and other information related to our ministry. They were able to open a church with 65 adults plus teens and children.

The UN had set aside land with plots for new churches and we were so blessed to be able to get a plot. We began to pray fervently for money for a tin building, musical instruments, chairs, and a simple sound system. The total amount we have been praying for came in from one U.S. church today, so we are beyond overjoyed.

As soon as we get the building completed, we can also open a Bible College. We can train people to take the gospel back to their own countries.

Please pray for Pastor Faustine Choma, the new pastor in the refugee camp, and for the Lord to provide \$80 a month for his support.



Closer to home, our Evangelism bus that opens into a stage is ready to roll. We also need \$300 a month for fuel and food as the evangelism team travels to spread the Gospel through messages, songs, and puppets.
